Christian Churches Together

Christian Churches Together is a gathering – marked by prayer, worship, fellowship and dialogue—in which churches and Christian organizations can develop relationships with other churches and organizations. Traditionally many of these churches have had little or no contact with each other.

WHAT MAKES CCT DIFFERENT?

Christian Churches Together offers a space that is inclusive of the diversity of Christian families in the United States — Evangelical, Orthodox, Roman Catholic, Pentecostals, historic Protestant, Racial and African American churches. CCT employs the consensus model for decision making, which ensures a careful process of listening and discussing. CCT maintains a minimal institutional structure.

CCT PURPOSES

Celebrate a common confession of faith in the triune God; discern the guidance of the Holy Spirit through prayer & theological dialogue; provide fellowship & mutual support; seek better understanding of each other by affirming commonalities and understanding our differences; foster evangelism faithful to the proclamation of the gospel; speak to society with a common voice whenever possible and to promote the common good of society; and engage in other activities consistent with this purposes.

COOPERATION AND ACTION

We affirm that being together and building relationships is doing something. Out of the process of growing together, participants discern how and when to take action together in common witness to our society. Together and between themselves CCT participants have already carry out projects of common witness in the areas of poverty, racial justice and evangelism.

WHY JOINING CCT?

CCT offers denominations and Christian organizations the possibility of face-to-face relationships with participants across the major church families in the USA. As they grow closer together in Christ, differences can be better understood and commonalities affirmed. In praying and studying the scriptures together, spiritual connections will deepen and prophetic voices strengthened. There will be new possibilities for shared witness and new partnerships formed among the churches.

LOCAL EXPRESSIONS OF CCT
